## HIGHLAND SCHOOL

### *Strategy 3*

Highland School increased on the Academic Performance Index (API) for the third year in a row. For 2003-04, the API increase was 27 points, exceeding the expected target of 11 points. The 2002-03 increase was 26 points. The school is celebrating, also, that the AYP (No Child Left Behind) criteria for percentage of students in the Proficiency band, was made in Math for all subgroups except English Learners.

In terms of working towards "Each Student Literate", the fact that the API continues to exceed targets indicates that our team is moving students forward on a consistent basis and demonstrates the team's hard work and commitment to move all students to the next level.
