ITEM: CONSENT: Approve Monterey High School's Out-of-State Trip to Bay St. Louis, Mississippi, March 13-16, 2006

INTRODUCTION:

Permission is hereby requested to transport members of the Monterey High School Associate Student Body, the President, Vice President, and Activities Director, to Bay St. Louis High School, Bay St. Louis, Mississippi.

BACKGROUND:

Due to the massive hurricane that ravaged the southern portion of the United States, the City of Bay St. Louis has asked for assistance from outside communities to help in their relief effort for its citizens. The City of Monterey has an ongoing partnership with Bay St. Louis to help with future city planning, organizing relief efforts and offering further assistance for this devastated community. The Monterey High School's ASB will be visiting Bay St. Louis High School to offer their support in rebuilding their school.

OBJECTIVE(S):

Visiting students will bring back an awareness of the vast devastation in the local area and an understanding of what it will take to rebuild a community. They plan to help organize and support the school's first prom through donations of clothing, monetary funding, emotional support and planning. When the students return, they will be making presentations to local community organizations, schools, and a joining district with the objective of raising additional monies to support the adopted high school.

COST/FUNDING SOURCE/FISCAL IMPACT:

Students will be transported by plane to New Orleans and then by van to Bay St. Louis. During their stay, they will be housed at a local B & B that specializes in housing incoming relief workers. The cost of the trip, approximately \$500 per student, will be financed through local service organizations, the City of Monterey, and local company donations. There will be no cost to the district or to the students.




