**INTRODUCTION:**

The proposed attendance boundary for Marina High School will be as follows:

Beginning from the MPUSD boundary on the north end of the District, south along the beach to the north boundary of Marina Dunes State Park, then east to Highway 1, south to Lightfighter Drive, follow Light Fighter Drive east to the MPUSD boundary near Reservation Road along the bluffs near the Salinas River (including all of East Garrison Specific Plan Phases 1 and 2), then north along the MPUSD boundary to the point of origin.

All students in grades 9-12 in the new Marina High School attendance boundary will be assigned to Seaside High School. Ninth and tenth grade students will have the option of attending Marina High School in 2006-2007; and ninth through eleventh grade students in 2007-2008. Marina High School will be a school of choice until all four high school grades are offered in 2008-2009. Any student may also apply for an intradistrict or interdistrict transfer to attend Marina High School.

**BACKGROUND:**

A new attendance boundary is required to define the Marina High School attendance area.

**OBJECTIVE:**

To present a proposed attendance boundary area for Marina High School.



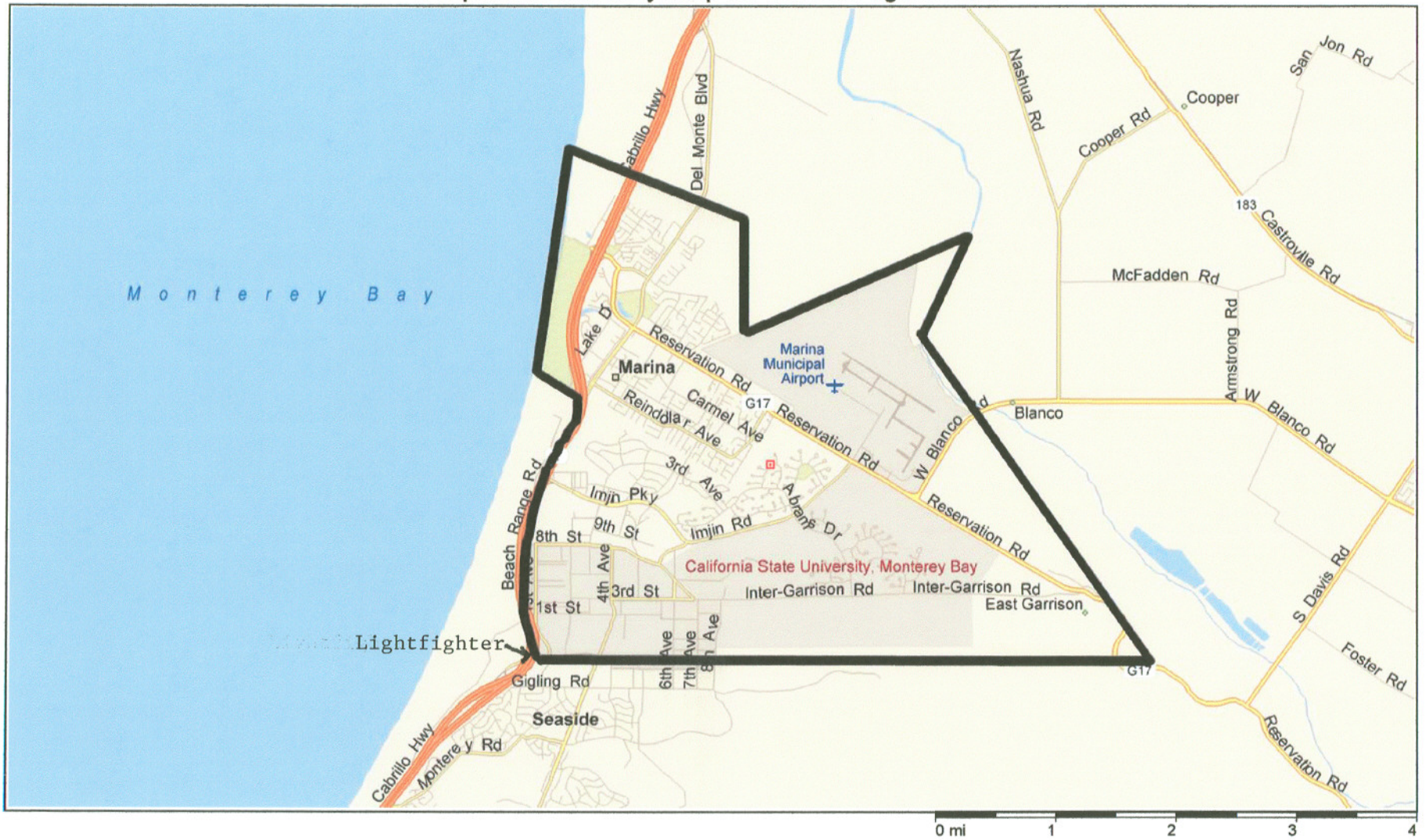

**INTRODUCTION:**

In February 2006, the Board approved Marina High School and designated the school site to be housed on the Central Coast High School site. Thus, there is a need to relocate the Central Coast High School Continuation program to another site.

**BACKGROUND:**

Central Coast High School has been located on its current campus since the 1996-1997 school year. It has proven to be a successful model, is in the process of WASC accreditation, and needs a new location to accommodate the program reconfiguration which will occur with the approval of our new Community Day School program.

There are really only two possible sites to relocate Central Coast High School. Those sites are Stilwell School and Hayes School.

- Stilwell School has been modernized and Hayes School has not.
- Stilwell School is wired with internet and is a large enough site that relocating this program to Stilwell will still allow the site to accommodate other programs such as Monterey County Office of Education special education classes, Dual Language Immersion Kindergarten Magnet program, and Cypress Grove Charter High School if it meets the Proposition 39 requirements and finds charter school approval.

**OBJECTIVE:**

To inform the Board of this new location site for Central Coast High School.

**COST/FUNDING SOURCE/FISCAL IMPACT:**

Each teacher will be given up to four days of per diem to facilitate their packing and movement of teacher materials.

**RECOMMENDATION(S):**


That the Board receive information related to the necessary move of the Central Coast High School program. This will return for Board approval on May 1, 2006.
